LAKE VALLEY SEED BRAND:

1982 Sunflower American Giant (*Helianthus annuus*) Annual

These giants grow 16' or taller with strong stocks to hold the huge 10" diameter sunflowers.

1980 Sunflower Junior (*Helianthus annuus*) Annual

The first pollen-free dwarf, branching sunflower. Grows only 2' tall with bright yellow 4" diameter flowers covering the bushy plant.

1981 Sunflower Starburst Mix (*Helianthus annuus*) Annual

Semi-double flower mix on tall, branching plants. Ruffled blossoms in mahogany, red, orange and yellow.

1984 Sweet Pea Little Sweetheart Mix (*Lathyrus odoratus*) Annual

Bushy plants 18 – 20" high in red, rose, pink, white, purple, lilac and blue. Great for containers or borders.

1983 Sweet Pea Streamer Mix (*Lathyrus odoratus*) Annual

Great fragrance and color. Perfectly white petals appear striped or flaked with a kaleidoscope of colors. A strong climber.

1978 Zinnia Peppermint Stick (*Zinnia elegans*) Annual

Eye-catching blotched and striped blossoms. Warm bright colors appear sprayed onto solid color petals. Bushy plants are 2 – 3' tall.

1979 Wildflowers Sunny Mix – Annual/Perennial

You'll pick beautiful bouquets! Colorful mix of varieties that prefer full sun. Enough seed to plant about 35 square feet.

1969 Dill Fern Leaf (*Anethum graveolens*) Annual

This dwarf dill was an All-America selections winner! Only 18" high, yet produces leaves and seed heads just like its taller cousin.

1988 Baby Bok Choy (*Brassica rapa chinensis*) Annual

A vigorous, compact and fast growing F1 hybrid, mature when only 6" high. The entire plant is edible and packed with nutrition.

1975 Bean Burpee Bush (*Phaseolus vulgaris*) Annual

This was the first absolutely stringless green-podded bush bean. Introduced by W. Atlee Burpee in 1894, over 100 years ago.

1986 Broccoli Waltham 29 (*Brassica oleracea*) Annual

Reliably produces 6" heads on 20" tall stocky plants. Open-pollinated plants produce many side shoots until hard frost.

1972 Carrot Little Finger (*Daucus carota*) Annual

Deep orange little roots are ready to harvest at just 3" long. Sweet flavor develops early. A real gourmet treat!

1985 Melon Minnesota Midget (*Cucumis melo*) Annual

An extra early canteloupe variety with incredibly sweet taste and scent. Harvest at just 3 – 4" in diameter. Vines only 3' long.

1989 Mustard Chinese (*Brassica rapa chinensis*) Annual

A mildly flavored quick-growing mustard. The entire plant is used raw or cooked. Known as Gai-Choi in Asian countries.

1974 Mustard Tendergreen (*Brassica rapa chinensis*) Annual

Smooth, dark green leaves taste like spinach with just a hint of mustard. Packed with vitamins. Cook greens or use raw in salads.

1977 Pea "Frosty" (*Pisum sativum*) Annual

"Frosty" Peas can sprout when soil is still 50° F. An extra early shelling pea variety. 4" pods contain 7 – 8 tasty peas.

1976 Pepper Santa Fe (*Capsicum annuum*) Annual

A medium-hot pepper about 3 ½" long with medium thick walls. Sturdy 2' tall plants give heavy yields. Green peppers left on the plant ripen from yellow, orange to red.

1987 Squash Winter Jumbo Pink Banana (*Cucurbita maxima*) Annual

Cylindrical fruits can weigh 50 lbs. Yellow-orange flesh is thick, firm, dry and never stringy. For pies, puddings, desserts, & canning.

1973 Tomato Mortgage Lifter (*Lycopersicon lycopersicum*) Annual

An heirloom variety that has huge, meaty fruits with few seeds. A pole-type variety with large yields of dark pinkish red tomatoes.

1971 Tomato Stupice (*Lycopersicon lycopersicum*) Annual

An ultra-early tomato that is cold tolerant and ripens with exceptional flavor. 4' tall vines with 2 ½" diameter bright, red tomatoes.
